There were two courses in AY 22/23 from which to gather data; AKNS A101E Elementary Alutiiq I in F22 and AKNS A102E Elementary Alutiiq II in SP23. The Program Chair gathered and analyzed data (final project scores, final grades, pass rates) collected from Blackboard course shell gradebooks. Individual discussions were held with the Kodiak College adjunct language instructor about course assessments and program needs.

Overall, of the two Alutiiq Studies program courses offered in AY 22/23, the pass rate was significant (85.4%) and the average grade was meaningful at 2.95. These, along with final projects (completion rate of 70.9% and final project grades of 94.2%) prime us that students are meeting their learning outcomes in one category;
